# Background on the Promise Zone Research Connection

In 2014, a section of West Philadelphia was federally designated as a Promise Zone. The goal was to reduce poverty and bring greater opportunity to those living, working, and going to school in the area.

The West Philadelphia Promise Zone has been heavily researched for years.

However, there is **no central community voice** about how this research is done.

The Promise Zone Research Connection will bridge the gap between researchers and Promise Zone residents and stakeholders. This will lead to benefits for the community, including: the prevention of harm; and increased quality of life, peace, and prosperity.

### Join the CRRB

#### What?

A group of trained residents and stakeholders who **review research proposals** that might affect the Promise Zone community.

### Why?

To help make sure that future research in the Promise Zone **benefits residents.** 

#### When?

Only one evening a month, for two to three hours at a time.

To communicate with research institutions, the PZRC has developed the Community Research Review Board (CRRB). The CRRB is a community partnership between Promise Zone research institutions and the PZRC. The CRRB will be made up of trained Promise Zone residents and stakeholders, who will review research proposals that affect the community.

The CRRB will create a **strong**, **unified voice** to help make sure that **research is conducted in a way that benefits Promise Zone residents** by (1) advocating for the interests of the community, (2) ensuring results are shared with the community, and (3) establishing a line of communication for future partnership.
